### Briefly describe the rationale for disestablishment:

There have been a decreasing amount of students in this program for many years. Also, high schools have been eliminating business programs so there is low demand for it any more.

#### Impact on other existing programs:

Course content is available in other majors, such as business and other secondary education concentrations.

#### Impact on current students:

Currently there are 9 students in this degree program. 2 of the students are currently in the professional program (one is waiting on their degree to post and the other will graduate in Spring 14). The other 7 students have yet to start the professional program and we will try to advise them into other concentrations or degrees. If they would like to do business with option to teach then they will be able to apply for the Secondary Certificate program.

## Additional information:

In addition to the low demand and few students, MLFTC no longer has faculty who are qualified to teach the courses. Due to low demand in this program, our future hiring plans are not likely to include people who can teach the courses. Admissions to this program should be stopped starting Fall 2014 to allow students that are already in the pipline to complete. The courses will continue to be offered as they are also a part of other programs, the methods course (BUE 480) will no longer be offered after Spring 2014. We will encourage students in the pipline to take this course.
