Briefly describe the rationale for disestablishment:

As a result of recently implemented enhancements to the BS in Kinesiology program, and subsequent changes to KIN course prerequisites, it is no longer possible to develop/offer a coherent and substantive minor within the credit limitations. In addition, demand for the minor has been steadily declining over the past 5 years with fewer than 15 students in total enrolling over that time span.

Impact on other existing programs: Could include availability of course content for students in other majors who may need it; other.

No other program or group of students will be negatively impacted. Individual KIN courses within the minor will still be offered to qualified students.

Impact on current students: Estimate number of students still enrolled; anticipated date of last graduates; arrangements for continuing students and students in articulated transfer pathways (ex. MAPP, TAG).

There are 14 students with a currently declared Minor in Kinesiology. It is anticipated that these students will complete their degrees and the declared minor by Spring 2013. These students will be contacted for individual conferences with KIN academic specialists to determine if each wishes to [a] continue in and complete the minor or [b] withdraw from the



minor. Students who wish to continue in the minor will need to meet current course entry requirements.
