Re: Disestablishment of the minors in Tourism Management and Recreation

Management

The School of Community Resources and Development, in consultation with its faculty and with Dean Debra Friedman's approval, is requesting the disestablishment of the minors in Tourism Management and Recreation Management, effective Fall 2009.

The minors were previously in the College of Human Services and moved to the College of Public Programs as part of the Fall 2008 reorganization. The College of Public Programs has similar minors in Tourism Development and Management, Recreation Management and Parks, Protected Area Management, and Nonprofit Administration. New students (new admits to the university and students changing minors) will be able to select from those options.

Students who are currently enrolled in the programs, including BIS students, will be able to finish their degree without interruption or delay. Additionally, they will have various other similar options in the College of Public Programs. The School will work with the students to provide them with appropriate course equivalencies when necessary. Therefore, there will be no negative impact on current students.
