

Re: Disestablishment of the B.S. in Recreation and Tourism Management

The School of Community Resources and Development, in consultation with its faculty and with Dean Debra Friedman's approval, is requesting the disestablishment of the BS in Recreation and Tourism Management, effective Fall 2009.

This major was previously in the College of Human Services and moved to the College of Public Programs as part of the Fall 2008 reorganization. The College of Public Programs has two similar programs for ASU students: the B.S. in Parks & Recreation Management and the B.S. in Tourism Development & Management. New students (new admits to the university and students changing their major) will be able to select from these two options.

Students who are currently enrolled in the program will be able to finish the degree without interruption or delay. Additionally, they will have various other similar options in the College of Public Programs. The School will work with students to provide them with appropriate course equivalencies when necessary. Therefore, there will be no negative impact on current students.
