1. OVERVIEW. Below, please provide a brief overview of the certificate, including the rationale and need for the program, potential size and nature of the target audience, information on comparable programs (at ASU and/or peer institutions), how this program would relate to existing programs at ASU, and any additional appropriate information.

The proposed certificate in Integrated Behavioral Health - Management is designed to provide training to master's level health care managers (or aspiring health care managers) on the integration of medical and behavioral services. Integrated healthcare has expanded significantly in recent years in conjunction with the expansion of the Primary Care Medical Home (PCMH) model and other funding initiatives that reimburse primary care practices for better managing the whole-healthcare of their patients, including treatment of mental health concerns and enhanced behavior change coaching that result in improved health outcomes. Despite the growing need for such clinics, few individuals have received training on models of primary care integration and business/funding initiatives required for successful integration.

Existing certificate programs on primary care behavioral health integration are offered through the University of Massachusetts Medical School's Center for Integrated Primary Care (http://www.umassmed.edu/cipc/). This certificate program is based on continuing education credits rather than academic credits, and are therefore primarily focused on distance-learning approaches to didactic education. Additionally, existing certificates are clinically-oriented in nature, rather than focused on the necessary skills to serve as a manger of integrated services. In comparison, the Integrated Behavioral Health- Management certificate is designed to provide students with a deeper understanding of models of primary care behavioral health, population based health, and quality and performance improvement to ensure applicants have a working knowledge of the business of healthcare delivery. All are key skills necessary for success in the integrated primary care arena.

2. ADMINISTRATION AND RESOURCES

A. How will the proposed certificate be administered (including recommendations for admissions, student advisement, retention etc.)? The Doctor of Behavioral Health (DBH) program administration will hold primary responsibility for all faculty and graduate support staff for the Integrated Behavioral Health - Management graduate certificate. Recommendations for admissions will be made by DBH faculty based on a review of application materials (as outlined below), and the current DBH Student Services Assistant will enter admissions decisions into PeopleSoft. Graduate advisement will initially be conducted by current DBH Core faculty as consistent with the DBH program's model; however, with growth and expansion of the certificate program and additional behavioral health and integration-focused programs, it is anticipated that a Graduate Advisor will eventually be hired to assist in this process.

Primary responsibility for this program will be through the DBH program administration through the CHS dean's office, but few additional needs for the certificate are currently anticipated. Curriculum is already developed as part of the DBH core and elective coursework. The CHS Dean's Office has approved these certificates.

Establish Satisfactory Academic Progress Policies, Processes and Guidelines - Check within the proposing academic unit and/or college to see if there are existing academic progress policies and processes in place. Include in the handbook the unit/college satisfactory academic progress policies, current degree program requirements (outlined in the approved proposal) and provide a link to the Graduate Policies and Procedures website.
