1. Overview

A. Description

The minor or BIS concentration in Music Theatre allows students who have a background, interest, and/or passion in music theatre to continue their studies and further explore the craft. Students will explore techniques for the singing actor and dancer through a menu of courses as well as learn specific production skills.

B. Why should this be a minor rather than a concentration?

A concentration would require significant training standards across multiple disciplines (music, theatre, dance), including a greater commitment and number of credits. The minor in Music Theatre will allow students to add a skill set to complement existing majors in music, theatre, or other performing arts, as well as those with interest in the subject in other majors.

BMus - Performance (Music Theatre) -- The minor or BIS concentration provides non-music majors space to explore other areas of study that may interest them, without commanding as many required credits per semester.

D. Demand

There is an interdisciplinary connection to other degrees, particularly in the School of Film, Dance, and Theatre (i.e. BA - Performance and Movement) and the New College program in Interdisciplinary Arts and Performance. There has also been evidence of increased interest in musical theatre as an art form, perhaps due to the popularity of the musical *Hamilton* and the commercial success of Broadway musicals in general over the past decade; it is also demonstrated by a larger number of students asking permission to take MUP 170 Music Theatre I each year. Added sections of MUP 170 and MUP 172 Music Theatre II instantly reached capacity. Numerous students each year from across ASU campuses inquire about a minor in music theatre. The added minor would significantly increase FTE in a department where FTE is already steadily on the rise.

A minor or BIS concentration in musical theatre will connect well with degree programs in the School of Film, Dance, and Theatre: particularly BA-Performance and Movement, BA-Theatre, BA-Digital Culture, and BA-Film, where students have proven to be interested in multiple areas of artistic expression and have personal goals for being well-rounded artists. Thus far, the faculty of ASU Music Theatre and Opera have noticed the most connection here between the School of Music and School of Film, Dance, and Theatre. Additionally, the minor may likely be ideal for Interdisciplinary Arts and Performance majors, the creative-minded business majors or science majors, or any students who may be feeling the pressure (familial or otherwise) to major in a field for employment or "backup plan" purposes that does not necessarily align with their passions.

E. New courses

MUP 467 Music Theatre Dance Technique is designed for students to gain a basic understanding of body awareness and alignment, strength and technique with a focus on musical theatre vocabulary as well as basic turns and leaps. The first semester students focus on the individual dancer, spatial awareness, development of character and intention. The second semester students work on basic partnering skills and partner dances.

Note: All new required courses should be submitted in Curriculum Changemaker and ready for Provost's Office approval before this certificate is put on Curriculum and Academic Programs Committee (CAPC) agenda.

An audition is required for entrance into the minor or BIS concentration and MUP 121 and MUP 170 study. Audition criteria are determined by area faculty.

Two songs (whole songs, not cuttings) total, to be performed with live piano accompaniment (accompanist provided, or you may choose to bring your own). Both songs must be from musicals, and they must contrast one another. One must demonstrate a legitimate style of singing utilizing legato line, and the other can be a contrasting style of your choosing (including pop/rock and belting).

Note: You may elect to perform one classical selection (an art song or an aria from opera or oratorio) instead of two songs from musicals. The classical piece may be in English or in a foreign language. This could be in place of either piece.

- Monologue: One monologue from a musical or a play not exceeding one minute in length will be performed separately from the singing and dance audition.
- Dance Assessment: All applicants must perform a dance assessment separate from the singing audition. The purpose
 of the assessment is to gain a full picture of the complete musical theatre performer. Students should wear comfortable
 movement or dance attire and character shoes or shoes that are easy to move in. Students will be taught two brief
 combinations. There will be dressing rooms available in which to change before and after the dance audition. The
 dance and monologue audition will take place prior to the singing audition.

Administration of the minor and BIS concentration will be aligned to the same process in place for the major degree program, BMus - Performance (Music Theatre). Enrollment will be managed through the audition process; advisement will be handled through the Herberger Institute advising office; retention and completion will be a joint effort between music theatre faculty, School of Music staff, and the Herberger Institute advising office.

Program Requirements

The minor or BIS concentration requires 24 hours (12 upper-division) in performance, history, theory and electives.

Students may transfer up to nine credit hours toward the minor.
