PROPOSAL TO CHANGE THE NAME OF AN ACADEMIC PROGRAM (Degree, Concentration, Certificate, Minor)

Briefly describe the proposed change and rationale for the change:

The name change to Translation Studies will ensure a higher visibility of the program across ASU's campuses. A Translation Studies certificate reflects the current design of courses in the program, which are focused on literary materials but also include a wide range of discursive textual, visual, and aural media. Signaling this broader concept in the title will thus make the certificate more appealing to students in arts, communication, education, and international business disciplines. Likewise, the broader concept will achieve greater recognition for those completing the program in the global marketplace, where Translation Studies is the standard designation for professional programs of this kind.

The field of translation has rising relevance as a vital instrument of literature, diplomacy, media, communication, and international business. The five-course, trans-disciplinary graduate program of the Translation Studies certificate prepares students entering all these fields. Within the university system, the Translation Studies certificate, staffed jointly by The Department of English and the School of International Letters and Cultures, complements at the graduate level already existing undergraduate certificate programs in the School of International Letters and Cultures and English in Translation (Spanish-specific), European Union Studies, and TESOL, The faculty in these units provide expert instruction in professional translation (both textual and media-centered), language and linguistic theory, and literary translation in a variety of languages that play a role in the world marketplace. The Translation Studies certificate thus provides advanced training and professionalization for translators who go on to work in fields vital to the global economy, where "Translation Studies" is the standard designation for professional programs of this kind.

Discuss the impact of this change on current students and/or enrollment:

Since Translation Studies reflects the widely accepted definition of the discipline, the design of the certificate as it is offered now, and the common designation for professional programs of its kind, students will find that the Translation Studies certificate will open many new doors for employment in the global economy. Current students were contacted regarding the name change and were in favor of the new name.
