### I. Description of the proposed organizational unit change

- a. Explain the nature of the change; i.e., formation of a new unit or reorganization of an existing unit. Two existing units of the Herberger Institute for Design and the Arts will be reorganized into two new units. The School of Film, Dance and Theatre (existing) and the School of Music (existing) will be reorganized into The New American Film School (new) and the School of Music, Dance and Theatre (new).
- b. Identify the existing unit(s) affected by the change and its place in the current organizational structure of the university.

The existing units affected are the current School of Film, Dance and Theatre and the current School of Music, which are two of six units (five schools and the Art Museum) in the Herberger Institute for Design and the Arts. Film will separate from Dance and Theatre and become a separate school. Dance and Theatre will merge with Music to form a single school.

### II. Purpose and activities of the unit



# **a.** Explain the rationale for the change.

### The New American Film School

ASU has the opportunity to become the largest, most egalitarian, most innovative film school in the nation, working in state-of-the art production facilities in Mesa with access to Los Angeles through the FilmSpark program and our evolving presence in the Herald Examiner building. The ASU film program is one of the fastest growing in the country, increasing from 0 to almost 700 students in 8 years. It is also one of the most diverse, standing in stark contrast to film programs at other institutions.

### School of Music, Dance and Theatre

The current School of Music is one of the top schools of music at a public university in the US and ranks in the top 25 of all music schools in terms of graduate education. In addition to a strong performance and ensemble program, it is nationally renowned for its music therapy, music education, and jazz programs. The school is launching a new popular and commercial music program in 2020. The current dance program has a distinguished history and is among the most innovative dance programs in the country. The program continues to push new interdisciplinary approaches to dance, social dance, urban dance and movement, and social practice. The theatre program is solid, with a signature program in Theatre for Youth and an innovative Performance in the Americas degree. Theatre has enormous potential to grow in size and importance, especially in areas of production and design. The synergies created by housing these related arts in one school will boost national reputation, grow enrollment, and serve students more effectively.

# **b.** Identify the basic goals and objectives of the new or reorganized unit(s).

The New American Film School

1. Grow the immersion film program, including greater access to film production track in addition to studies in film history, industry practices, producting, and screenwriting.

- 2. Build a new online degree in Film and Media Production.
- 3. Increase the ranking of the school from 24 to top 15.

4. Build new academic tracks in short-form storytelling and concentrations in immersive, virtual reality, and aumented reality filmmaking consistent with future filmmaking careers.

5. Expand and fully realize FilmSpark 2.0, creating four times as many internships in Los Angeles, fully activating the Sun Devil Hollywood alumni network, and building LA-based bootcamps and professional development for students and recent alums.

- 6. Build a California strategy for film students in California community colleges to complete degrees at ASU.
- 7. Design programs and pathways for ASU students to spend a summer, semester or year in Los Angeles.

School of Music, Dance and Theatre

1. Enhance opportunities and investment in ambitious multi-discipinary and collaborative live performances.

2. Build the nation's best live performance production and technical degree by offering an unprecedented set of opportunities for students studying lighting, set, costume and sound design, as well as media production and stage management across the discipines of music, dance and theatre.

3. Enhance one of our most popular, successful, and highly ranked programs– musical theatre – by integrating theatre, dance and music, making it one of the few programs nationally that builds seamlessly upon all three disciplines.

4. Provide opportunities for the development of new works (new commissions) that span music, theatre, and dance disciplines.

5. Strengthen programs in urban and popular performance and movement (dance) by integrating urban music and performance, to create one of the few schools in the country where students can concentrate in hip hop, Latin, and other urban art forms.

6. Bring together faculty and graduate students in music education, dance education and theatre for youth in order to strengthen ASU's position as the number one producer of arts instructors in the state of Arizona, and build online professional certification for teaching artists across the state and nation.
