The proposal is marginally developed and documented. The syllabus is presented without much detail or insight. There is not a clear and dominant focus on studying and understanding human interaction with socio-behavioral perspectives and research grounding the material and work. The course appears to focus on institutional and relatively abstract perspectives of economics and health care. There is a strong micro/individual choice orientation as expressed in the proposal and text materials.
