We were founded to keep college sports safe. Today, we work hard to promote safety, excellence, and physical and mental well-being for student-athletes.

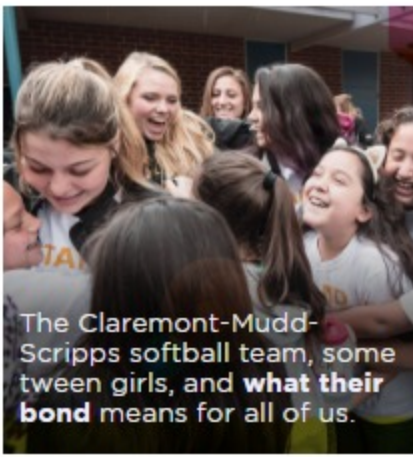
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FAIRNESS

St. Michael's hockey players help campus get comfortable talking about mental health.



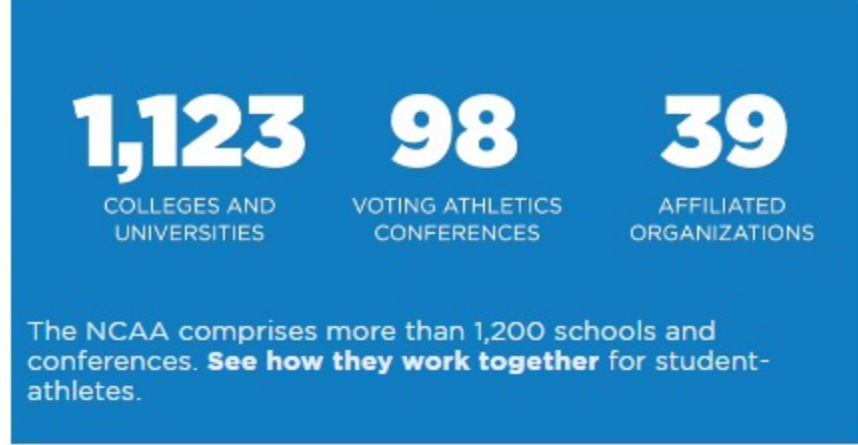
Where does the money go? NCAA schools distribute more than \$2.9 billion in athletics scholarships each year.



Only a fraction of the nearly 8 million current high school athletes in the United States will go pro.



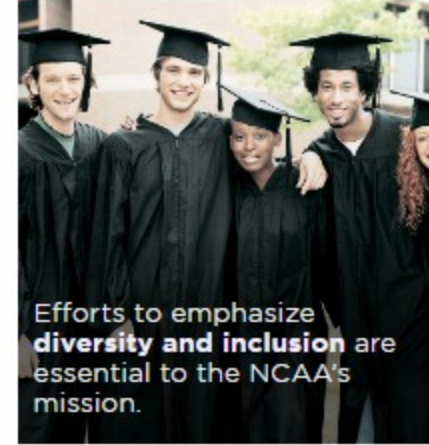

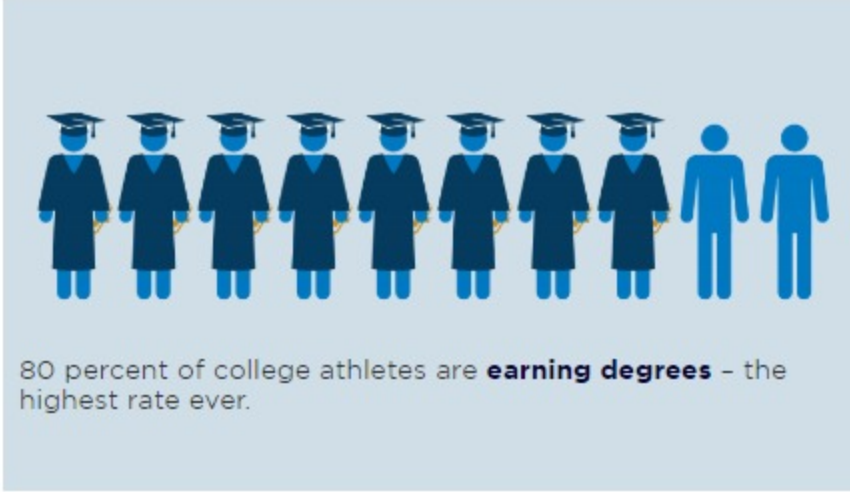

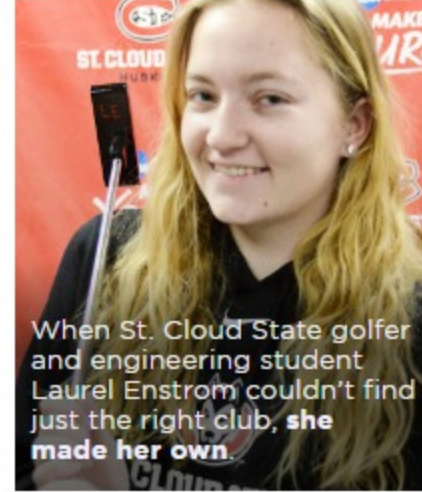
The NCAA's Sport Science Institute promotes health and safety through research and training.



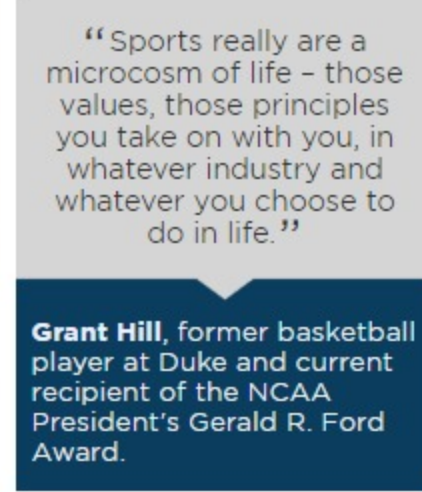
Efforts to emphasize diversity and inclusion are essential to the NCAA's mission.

Only teams that make the grade can participate in championships, and Division I schools' share of revenue will be tied to academics.



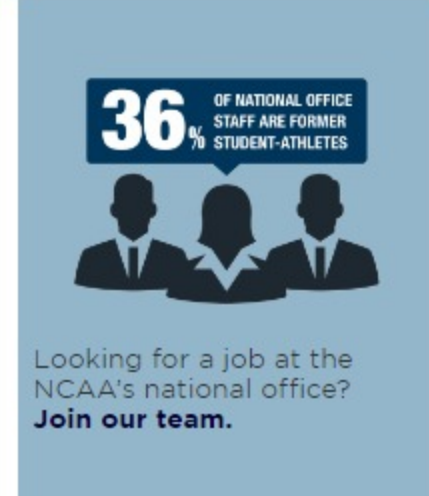
