Accelerated Program

The School of Humanities, Arts and Cultural Studies offers a BA in ethnicity, race and First Nations studies in the New College of Interdisciplinary Arts and Sciences at ASU's West campus.

The first such program in Arizona, this program provides an integrated, comparative and comprehensive approach to the study of diversity among ethnic and racial groups and First Nations. A highlight of the program is the internship, which fosters direct links between the university and community-based settings. Both theoretical and applied perspectives are embedded in a curriculum addressing how ethnicity, race and First Nations shape identities, literacies, public policies and communities in local and transnational U.S. contexts. Students identify a career area enabling them to integrate their knowledge with specific coursework tied to their career and advanced educational goals.
