Arizona welcomes veterans

On April 12, 2011, Arizona Governor Jan Brewer signed HB 2410 into law, allowing **in-state student status for tuition purposes to honorably discharged veterans** of any branch of the United States Armed Forces, including National Guard and Reserves.
