## **2016-17 Annual Report Highlights**

## **Service Measures**

- Housed 12,628 students across four locations of which 7,900 were freshmen.
- Managed 19,150 calls for service through the Housing Customer Care center and 1,771 calls for support through Housing IT.
- Student Rights and Responsibilities handled 4,103 incidents involving 6,298 students.
- Health Services had 62,978 Total Visits (up 5% from 59,979)
- Health Services served 19,919 unique students (up 3% from 19,339)
- Health Services decreased appointment wait time by 23%
- Counseling Services had 24,075 total visits (up 13% from 21,304)
  - 4,240 unique students (up 23% from 3,447)
  - 8,299 individual appointments
  - 3,322 group counseling appointments (an increase of 116% over PY)
  - 4,659 consultations
- 1,815 students were supported by Advocacy and Assistance, an increase of 26% over AY 2015-16.
- 10,008 incoming freshmen and 6886 guests attended an ASU Orientation program.
- 1.8M visits to the Sun Devil Fitness Centers, an increase of 6.6% over prior year.
- Over 1,000 students participated in Safety Education classes this year including CPR, Lifeguard Training, and Water Safety Instructor.
- Sport Club Participation: 1298 people participate in 62 clubs, a growth of 14 clubs from previous year.
- Disability Resources Center served 3,518 unique students, an increase of 14% over prior year.
- Students completed 1,400,000 community service hours.
- TRIO @ ASU college programs provided 27,406 hours of tutoring to 615 students and over 3,000 hours of community service performed by TRIO participants
- Memorial Union, Tempe hosted 10,751 meetings and events and 3,494 mall reservations

## **Student Engagement and Affinity**

- 8,500 students attended the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Infernofest in Wells Fargo Arena featuring recording artist Ke\$ha.
- Devils on Mill averaged 5,970 students per event, eclipsing 9,000 at a single event for the first time ahead of the California game on September 24<sup>th</sup>. This year also set a record for total attendance at the event, with 29,850 attendees for the season.
- Total student football attendance was 38,736 students, an increase of 600 students per game.
- 1,500 people attended the inaugural "Mill Madness" showcasing ASU Men's and Women's basketball teams.
- Men's Basketball attendance averaged 975 per game while classes were in session.
- 12,050 students, faculty and staff attended Fork 'em Fridays events at the Tempe Memorial Union.
- Devilpalooza attracted over 10,000 students to SDFC fields for a concert and carnival.
- MU After Dark hosted 12 events with 7,750 students.
- Union Plaza and North Plaza Programming offered over 124 programs attended by 30,693 participants during the academic year.
- Finals Breakfast on all four campus locations served 6,502 students, a 16% increase over the previous year.
- Over 1,050 student organizations hosted 5,554 events and meetings for students.
- Over 400 Downtown students enjoyed Fall Fest which includes pumpkin decorating, photo booths, food, and fall activities.
- 251 freshmen participated in Camp Solera as part of their welcome experience at ASU West.
- 1,430 students participated in PAB's Homecoming Carnival at West. Another 850 participated in Sparky's 5K.
- Council of Coalitions collaborated, coordinated and/or supported the first university-wide Pride Week, International Night and hosted international speakers such as DeRay McKesson (Tempe), Matika Wilbur (Poly), and Kim Chi (West).
- American Indian Council successfully collaborated with Undergraduate Student Government to draft a bill to recognize Oct. 12<sup>th</sup>, Columbus Day as Indigenous People's Day.
- Over 3,000 students attended Coalition of International Students' International Night.
- 112 student organizations are affiliated with one of the 7 cultural coalitions; a growth of 20 organizations over the past year.
- Culturefest showcased the diversity and culture of ASU with over 4,000 in attendance.

- "Express Yourself" offered 34 performances featuring student musicians, poets, dancers, etc. across four ASU locations, culminating in the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual "ASU's Got Talent" competition in April.
- 19 programs were held in celebration of International Education Week with over 3,900 people in attendance.
- 1,075 students applied to be University Housing Community Assistants, the highest number of applicants to date.
- The More to Explore Event hosted over 400 incoming students for an overnight experience on West, Polytechnic, Downtown and Tempe locations combined.
- Hosted 85 unique conference groups during summer 2017.
- Students raised \$80,500 for the Valley of the Sun United Way and completed 4890 hours of service during Sun Devils Unite Week.
- 8,225 guests participated in ASU Family Weekend 2016

## Wellness

- 45,164 students participated in wellness-related programming during AY 2016-17.
- Trained 295 students for the Sun Devil Support Network, bringing the total to 420 trained students serving as peer advocates and educators.
- 27,872 students new to ASU completed Community of Care, including 98% of FTFTF.
- 5,738 unique students participated in in-person Sexual Violence Prevention workshops including programs such as Consent 101, Step Up!, and CRASH (Consent, Rape Culture, Abuse, Sexual Assault and Healthy Relationships).
- 5,129 unique students completed online consent education through Consent and Respect, Above the Influence and Alcohol-Wise.
- Coordinate an effort to involve 93 departments and organizations across ASU to participate in Denim Day to bring awareness to Sexual Violence Prevention
- 15 events were hosted during Sexual Assault Awareness Month.
- Successfully launched "Recovery Rising" program to create a supportive environment for students in recovery from alcohol and drug addiction. Hosted 137 events reaching 3,005 students, faculty, staff and community members.
