

Undergraduate Career Outcomes

Report Description: This report describes some of the career outcomes of undergraduate students who graduated between Summer 2015 and Spring 2016. Employment and education information is from the Recent Graduate Survey. Internship information is from the Graduating Senior Report Card which students complete when they apply for graduation. Not everyone who participated in the surveys responded to every question.

Employment Outcomes

- 85% (2,641) of undergraduates were employed full or part-time approximately 90-days after graduation out of those that indicated they were employed or not employed and looking for work.
- 87% (2,698) of undergraduates were employed or received a job offer approximately 90-days after graduation out of those that indicated they were employed or not employed and looking for work.

Salary

- Of those respondents providing a salary, the average salary was \$43,352.

Employment Location

- Of the undergraduates that were employed and listed a location, 98.5% (2,364) were employed in the United States approximately 90-days after graduation.

Degree Programs

- Of those undergraduates that responded to the question about being enrolled, 21% (659) responded that they were enrolled in a degree program approximately 90-days after graduation. Of those undergraduates that indicated they were enrolled in any degree program and answered the question about enrollment status, 85% (545) were enrolled full-time.
- Of those undergraduates that responded to the question about being enrolled and indicated what degree program they were enrolled in, 19% (617) indicated that they were enrolled in a graduate or professional degree program either full or part-time.

Internships

- For the undergraduates responding to the question about how many internships they completed while working on their degree, 50% (4,231) completed at least one internship.
- Of the undergraduates that indicated they had at least one internship and responded to the question asking about internships for credit, 60% (2,520) indicated that they earned academic credit for any of their internships.
- Of the undergraduates that indicated they had at least one internship and responded to the question about paid internships, 44% (1,849) indicated that their most significant internship was paid.

Graduate Career Outcomes

Internship information is from the Graduate and Law Student Report Card which students complete when they apply for graduation. Not everyone who participated in the surveys responded to every question. This report includes online students. Employment Outcomes

- 90% (1,740) of graduate students were employed full or part-time approximately 90-days after graduation out of those that indicated they were employed or not employed and looking for work.
- 92% (1,762) of graduate students were employed or received a job offer approximately 90-days after graduation out of those that indicated they were employed or not employed and looking for work.

Salary

- Of those respondents providing a salary, the average salary was \$63,336.85.

Degree Programs

- Of those graduate students that responded to the question about being enrolled, 8% (154) responded that they were enrolled in a degree program approximately 90-days after graduation. Of those graduate students that indicated they were enrolled in any degree program and answered the question about enrollment status, 82% (123) were enrolled full-time.
- Of those graduate students that responded to the question about being enrolled and indicated what degree program they were enrolled in, 8% (148) indicated that they were enrolled in a graduate or professional degree program either full or part-time.

Internships

- For the graduate students responding to the question about how many internships they completed while working on their degree, 42% (1,535) completed at least one internship.
- Of the graduate students that indicated they had at least one internship and responded to the question asking about internships for credit, 75% (1,148) indicated that they earned academic credit for any of their internships.
- Of the graduate students that indicated they had at least one internship and responded to the question about paid internships, 48% (728) indicated that their most significant internship was paid.
